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## **Diversity - Blessing and challenge**

Nano Nagle wrote, "If I could be of any service in saving souls in any part of the globe, I would willingly do all in my power." Little did she know that her dream would come true as Presentation people and ministries are now worldwide. The spirit of the order she founded two hundred and fifty years ago is still strong and transformational.

The blessings of the Presentation charism are enormous. As Michael Green fms reminds us, a tradition allows for more sources of inspiration than only the lives of its great characters. It provides a story to learn, tell and feel part of, sacred places to visit, folklore that carries the values and beliefs in usual human ways, even books to read and songs to sing ... (2000. A Journal of Marist Education. Vol. 3. No.2). In other words, charism enriches and sustains through the life and example of its founders.

Charism cannot be limited to a specific location or time. It is a dynamic phenomenon and the result of the Spirit's work. This charism challenges us to see how Nano's vision and values are manifested in our modern world, which is characterised by different social and cultural contexts.

The Presentation charism's blessings are enriched by diverse cultures and people who respond to Nano's challenge. However, contemporary challenges like online influence, ecological justice, declining Church authority, and scientific advances in human genetic engineering pose new obstacles to this mission. There are many other issues we could add to this list.

These realities challenge us to take the Presentation charism out of its box and ask:

- Do all Friends of Nano groups have to be the same?
- Is there a 'right' way of being Presentation?
- What blessings can we embrace from the cultural diversity in our international conversations?
- How do we celebrate our differences?
  - What would Nano say about our global outreach today?
- Why are international conversations so essential, and what can we learn from each other?

Nano Nagle lived in a primarily mono-cultural world. Even though Cork was a trading centre, there were not many influences from other countries, and people hardly questioned the usual way of doing things and the assumptions about life, worth, and value. Nowadays, we live in a genuinely multicultural society, and our *Friends of Nano* movement must recognise and accept this diversity and figure out what it means for our future.

#### **Partnership with the Divine**

#### Friends of Nano gather in Pakistan



Meetings of our *Friends of Nano* Groups around the globe follow similar patterns as we renew our partnership with the Divine. Here is an account of a gathering in Pakistan:



In early December, fourteen *Friends of Nano* gathered in the Presentation Convent High School, Sargodha, Pakistan. The opening prayer, led by Nish Francis, was followed by the Hymn "10,000 reasons". Shehnaz Khurshid proclaimed the Gospel from Matthew.

After a time of silence and reflection we shared in the bigger group. Gretta Gill PBVM (Link Sister for Pakistan) asked a few concluding questions. During the tea break we had time for renewing friendships.

At the start of the second session Ms. Munaza read a paragraph from **'One Pace Beyond. The Life of Nano** 

**Nagle'** by Raphael Consedine, PBVM (p.164). This tells of the Christmas celebration when Nano Nagle and her sisters invited fifty poor people. In small groups we reflected and discussed: *How did Nano and her sisters celebrate their first Christmas and how would we plan to celebrate Christmas this Year?* After **fruitful discussions** we shared in the big group.

To end the meeting Sr. Gretta linked the two questions with the Gospel reading and shared seven secrets of happiness. The meeting ended in the spirit of Christmas with all the *Friends of Nano* enthusiastic about celebrating with the poor and needy of our present day so that Jesus may be born again with love and peace.

#### Friends of Nano respond to flooding in South India



Just before Christmas there was flooding in South India and the Presentation Family collaborated with other agencies to assist. Isabel Thomas reports, "It's the people who live on the streets and makeshift houses that really get hit. The homeless and those affected by the floods will be sheltered, fed, and given medical aid in government schools, so schools won't work for a few days till the homeless are relocated. The *Friends of Nano* reached out to three tribal villages on 22 December. Presentation students and sisters gave provisions to 120 pensioners. Other Presentation convents and schools have reached out to the elderly and a few families who are homeless near their

convents. Our Parent Teachers Association and Lions Club distributed tarpaulins to cover the top of huts which were damaged by the wind. Many areas did not have power,

Following in Nano's footsteps, Margaret Rosair, a *Friend of Nano* for many years, shared the celebration of her 75th birthday with the residents of Jeevan Jyothi Ilam, a home for the

destitute elderly. She, and her very supportive husband Ian, sponsored and served lunch for the residents of this very special place in November. They were accompanied by Justin and Judy Stephenson (*Friends of Nano*, Perambur). The senior citizens felt extremely happy to be included in this birthday meal.

Margaret leads by example in influencing the younger members of her family. Last August her grandson, Ayden Nicholas, celebrated his birthday in a home where 30 street boys live. He knew from his grandmother not just to donate old toys, no longer used or liked, but also to share treasured gifts. At Christmastime, cricket sets and footballs were also bought for the home.

Reflecting on such outreach experiences, Margaret simply said that she was following Nano Nagle who, like St. Clare of Assisi, discovered herself in the "mirror of the cross" through the love of Jesus. This empowered her to love

#### **Collaboration is key**

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Friends of Nano in the US Unit who have been engaged in advocacy for

vulnerable groups have found collaboration is the key to success in many areas. For the feast of St. Josephine Bakhita on February 8, they participated in a Solidarity Walk and Prayer Vigil (with one station at the statue of Nano Nagle) organized by the Bridge of Light Ministry, in St. Irenaeus parish in Cypress, California, which unites with other groups dedicated to ending the scourge of human trafficking and supporting the survivors of this type of modern slavery. *Click on the photo for a Taize-style Prayer Service*.

As part of the Interfaith Welcome Coalition, *Friends of Nano* help asylum seekers released by Homeland Security traveling through San Antonio, Texas, to pursue their cases. Volunteers provide travelers with food, water, diapers, medicine, backpacks, ticket purchasing and communication assistance, and orientation about the details of their journey (sometimes more than 48 hours) to their sponsors. They also advocate for changes to immigration policies.

In Fargo, North Dakota, Associates have routinely joined forces with other groups to sponsor educational opportunities like the "Ramadan Primer for Non-Muslims" on March 3; undertaken initiatives to end local homelessness; taken part in demonstrations that raise awareness of Indigenous Peoples' issues (environmental rights and the boarding school scandals); urged a cease-fire in Palestine. Every year, they sponsor a Rejuvenation event for local Social Justice advocates. This year's afternoon, called "Everything Is Connected", invites all justice people in the community to learn how to "Live Restoratively".

**Note:** At 59mins the video changes from Prayer Service to a 4-minute video on the Red Sand Project - specifically on Trafficking – and then a Global Hope 365 presentation aimed at raising awareness of Child Marriage, Human Trafficking and other forms of Gender-Based violence.

## **Covenant with creation**

#### Cry of the earth

Nagoa, Arpora Baga is a picturesque village in Goa known for its diverse flora and fauna. The landscape is a blend of hills, paddy fields, ponds, rivers, and mangroves, providing a home to exotic birds, marine turtles, wild boars, foxes, reptiles, fish, and oysters. The village has developed recently, and many resorts, hotels, and businesses have been established. This has led to environmental damage, destroying the biodiversity of the hills, mangrove areas, salt pans, and paddy fields.




As *Friends of Nano*, we follow Nano's teachings of caring for people experiencing poverty, which means caring for the Earth being damaged in our village. We decided to network and join other groups to make our voices heard. Luckily, our village council created various voluntary committees as support groups, including the Biodiversity Committee, which we joined as volunteers. We organized a clean-up

drive with the help of villagers and the council to address the issue of plastic litter being dumped in a pristine field. This drew attention to the problem of shops and restaurants disposing of plastic waste in

fields and ponds, contaminating the soil and freshwater. The council initiated daily garbage collection, and shops and restaurants were notified. We raised awareness about the mangrove destruction along the Baga River by preparing placards, inviting villagers, and sharing photos on social media. We're creating a People's Biodiversity Register to document the village's flora, fauna, medicinal plants, sacred groves, and landscape. This register will help us secure funding for a study from state biodiversity boards.








#### Young members
